

Protocols for spectators at indoor competitions (April 2021)
John Wood Community College Athletics

Current IDPH guideline – 20% capacity allowed/12 feet from playing surface

- Each participating student-athlete and coach has limited access to tickets.
- Remaining tickets are at the discretion of the Athletic Director
- Ticket Prices: FREE
- Access to check in and the game will start 30 minutes prior to game time – no access prior to that time.
- Opponent may request NO FANS at any of John Wood’s home games – if their administration is uncomfortable with fans in the stands. We will respect that request.
- Masks must be worn at all times
- All attendees will be required to complete a daily COVID symptom check the day of the contest.
- Restrooms will be available but have capacity limits.
- Fans will be asked to leave the Student Activity Center as soon as the game is over
- Seats will be sanitized between games
- No concessions will be offered
- Fans can bring refreshments – please clean and pick up all trash at the conclusion of the game.

In order to secure your ticket to a John Wood indoor competition:

- Sign up no later than 4 hours prior to game time – the game day link will be active a minimum of 24 hours prior to game time and closed 4 hours prior to game time.
 - Sign up for each game day can be found directly from one of our participating student-athletes, coaches, or via our athletic director.
 - Reminder: Each participant has access to only 2 spectator spots per contest.
- Upon sign up, will receive an email with a daily COVID symptom link (<https://machform.jwcc.edu/view.php?id=122985>) to complete the day of the game.
- Upon arrival, you will be checked in to confirm sign up, daily COVID symptom link completion, and receive a temperature check. If not signed up appropriately, answer ‘Yes’ to any symptom, or register a temperature higher than 100.4, you will be asked to leave the premises immediately. If cleared, each spectator will be guided to a section that they will be asked to sit in during the duration of the game.

We ask that all attendees respect the protocols and processes that are in place in order to see our student-athletes compete in person. It is the athletic department’s plan to continually revisit and adjust the protocols in order to remain safe, within all IDPH and Adams County Health Department, and provide the best game day experience we can provide.
